



## School Sports funding September 2016/17

### What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

### Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, by adding to the sports on offer and to make improvements that will benefit pupils in future years. Schools will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

### Possible uses of the funding include:

- Introduce and develop new sports to encourage more pupils to take part.
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Involve the least active children in PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and residential visits

This report outlines the expenditure of this grant for the academic year 2016-17. It will be updated at timely intervals. Although funding is released according to the financial year the school will report Sports spending for the academic year.
